Christians must allow the purity of the Christian heart to decide what will be worn in public. I know of a woman who is a member of the church who must have a fabulous wardrobe. She always has something on which looks as though it came directly from the department store window. And if she wears the same dresses more than once, she does so at such intervals that no one could tell that she did not have access to an infinite variety of garments. But though her clothing is the latest in styling and usually very modest, she always appears a bit underdressed. Her countenance seems naked. She rarely has a smile

or a kind word for anyone.

The expression of a Christian life can be the most precious of garments. It really isn't what one wears on the outside that draws people, but what one is inside. Some of us haven't learned this yet. One of the most obnoxious "Christians" I have ever met is meticulous about his dress. What he doesn't realize is that if he changed his personality, he could wear bib overalls and people would still love him.

Paul warned of overdressing and sug-gests that there is a certain amount of judgment and discretion involved in de-ciding what to put on. "Likewise, I want women to adorn themselves with proper clothing, modestly and discreetly, not with braided hair and gold or pearls or costly garments; but rather by means of good words, as befits women making a claim to godliness" (1 Tim. 2:9, 10). When we slip into our clothes each day, we ought to be able to say, "Father, I know that you will be pleased with this outfit today."

When dressing, it isn't really the ma-terial or the pattern of the garment that is of paramount concern, but rather, that we are wearing the Spirit of Christ (Gal. 3:27). Oh yes, there's one more thing. The next time you get dressed to go out — be sure to put on a smile!

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only-begotten Son" (John 3:16). "God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays his life down for the sheep" (John 10:11). Love means sacrifice. Sacrifice means a humbling of oneself for the good of another. And this is what the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ teaches us: Love means sacrifice.

We love our families. And we love them by sacrificing ourselves for them. We put their needs before our own. We sacrifice our own wants and desires for their good and for their needs.

We love our country. And we love it by pledging our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred honor to defend her. We ask not what our country can do for us, but what we can do for our country. We make sacrifices for our country's good and we do it because we love her.

We love our church. And we love our church by giving of ourselves, by sacrificing our time, talents, and treasures in service to it. We volunteer to teach Sunday School, VBS, and other various boards. We help out cleaning and fixing what needs to be cleaned and fixed at the church property. And we give a portion of the income God has given us, so that the lights will go on, and the heat and air conditioning may run; so that a pastor will preach to us both law and gospel and administer baptism and the

God has called us into these three spheres of family, country, and church. He puts the solitary into a home. No one is an island unto himself. Everyone is put into a family, a country, and a church. In these spheres, God cares for all our needs of body and soul. He employs other members of these spheres to ensure that we have everything we need for this body and life and for the next.

These callings place a claim upon us, a claim upon our presence, our prayers, our time, talents, and treasures. They give us a duty. That duty is to love. And love means sacrifice. And sacrifice means that we humble ourselves for the good of another.

So then, "let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another" (1 John 4:7–11). And love means sacrifice.

All About the Word

Jesus says, "The seed is the Word of God" (Luke 8:11). To illustrate the power of God's Word more accurately, the seed would have to be magnified billions and billions of times. Through His living Word, God not only created the world instantly, but through His Word in Baptism, God creates within us repentance, faith, justification (1Cor. 1:30) and a living hope that is eternal! (1Peter 1:3).

When God comes to us in His Word (Jesus is the Word in the flesh (John1:14) and we do not reject Him. God creates miracles in us and for us. Our relationship to God is all about the seed of the Word. God is always "at work" in those who believe (1Thess. 2:13)

God brings to the lifeless soil of our heart and mind the gift of His living Word (Matt. 13:3 ff.) The next time we think of faith, don't think of it as something we must do. Rather, think of faith as a wonderful gift from God! With our new forgiven status before God we will receive endless other gifts. These gifts come to us through God's Word. Begin receiving them by reading, meditating, and memorizing the first chapter of Ephesians.

Not only does God give us faith, forgiveness, and eternal hope but He also causes our faith to grow stronger. Every time we go to church to hear His living Word and receive Christ's body and blood, we are recreated and our faith grows stronger. Because the seed of God's Word is the most important and most powerful thing in our life!

The Number "Three" and Jesus

The study of numbers in the Bible is very interesting. A sort of spiritual mathematics. With "THREE" we come to the union, approval, co-ordination, completeness, and perfection. This is the number of the Trinity. THREE persons in One God. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. THREE members of Divine perfection.


The resurrection of our Lord on the THIRD day speaks of divine power. Jonah was THREE days and nights in the great fish as a sign of Christ's burial and resurrection.

Christ was crucified at the THIRD hour. The inscription over His head was written in THREE languages, suggesting the completeness of man's rejection of Christ. On the THIRD day, following His burial, He rose from the dead.

THREE persons were raised from the dead by Christ: Jairus' daughter, the widow's son, and Lazarus. This shows the completeness of His divine power in every stage of human existence, for the daughter of Jairus was 12 years old, just a girl; and Lazarus was full grown, an old man.

There are THREE offices of Christ which shows His perfection: Prophet, Priest, and King. The completeness of His Shepherd care is seen in these three titles: the Good, the Chief, and the Great Shepherd.

The perfection of Christ in His temptation is shown in His THREE fold use of "It is written!" THREE times the Heavenly Father spoke from heaven to His Son, showing His pleasure in the Son's obedience and the completeness in carrying out the mission for which He came.



Marinated Grilled Shrimp

"A very simple and easy marinade that makes your shrimp



so yummy you don't even need cocktail sauce! "

Prep time: 15 min Cook time: 6 min Ready in: 55 min

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 1/4 cup tomato sauce
- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh basil
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 2 pounds fresh shrimp, peeled and deveined
- skewers


Directions

- In a large bowl, stir together the garlic, olive oil, tomato sauce, and red wine vinegar. Season with basil, salt, and cayenne pepper. Add shrimp to the bowl, and stir until evenly coated.
 Cover, and refrigerate for 30 minutes to 1 hour, stirring once or twice.
- 2. Preheat grill for medium heat. Thread shrimp onto skewers, piercing once near the tail and once near the head. Discard marinade.
- 3. Lightly oil grill grate. Cook shrimp on preheated grill for 2 to 3 minutes per side, or until opaque.


Bible Verse
